Policy Priorities for the CFPB for 2016-2017

The CFPB recently announced its policy priorities for ensuring a fair marketplace and shared these goals with the members of their Consumer Advisory Board. They announced nine priority goals as the areas where they plan to devote significant resources and hope to make substantial progress during the next two years towards achieving more fairness in these markets. These goals also build on their rulemaking agenda and broader strategic plan.

The following nine priorities were identified:

- Arbitration
- Consumer reporting
- Debt collection
- Demand-side consumer behavior
- Household balance sheets
- Mortgages
- Open-use credit
- Small business lending
- Student lending

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IRS Tax Refund Options – Splitting Deposits

New this year, the IRS has stated that no more than three electronic funds can be directly deposited into a single financial account or pre-paid debit card (although credit unions have reported that this new policy may not yet be enforced.)

The following are five things you should know about splitting tax refund deposits:

- The refund can be divided into any savings or checking account (as long as the credit union accepts direct deposits for that type of account) and can be in any proportion of the total amount. The deposits do not have to be equal amounts;
- Savings accounts may include, for example, passbook savings, IRAs,
 HSAs, Archer MSAs, Coverdell education savings accounts and individual development accounts;
- The refund CANNOT be directed to someone else's account, except that a joint refund can be deposited into the spouse's account, if the credit union accepts joint refunds into individual accounts. Also, a taxpayer cannot opt for a direct deposit into a loan account;
- IRA tax refund deposits: The account owner is responsible for informing their IRA Trustee of the year for which the deposit is intended and for

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ensuring their contributions do not exceed their annual contribution limitations. IRS direct deposits of federal tax refund will not indicate a contribution year for IRA accounts; and

- What to do when your member doesn't receive the tax refund amount that he/she was expecting. Often in these situations the member will turn to the credit union for answers. A number of things can result in a tax refund check being less than expected:
 - The member could have made a mistake on the return that resulted in a lower than expected refund;
 - The member could have included an incorrect routing or account number; or
 - The refund could have been used to pay or off-set:
 - unpaid federal taxes
 - the Earned Income Tax Credit portion of the refund if it is pending further review
 - delinquent state income taxes
 - unpaid child support
 - delinquent non-tax federal debts, such as student loans, etc.

InfoSight Highlight Garnishment of Accounts with Federal Benefit Payments

The Department of Treasury, Social Security
Administration, Department of Veteran Affairs,
Railroad Retirement Board, and the Office of Personnel
Management (collectively referred to as the Agencies)
have finalized their rule to establish procedures for
financial institutions to follow when a garnishment
order is received against an accountholder who
receives certain types of Federal benefit payments
through direct deposit.

When a garnishment order is received, the rule requires financial institutions to determine the amount of Federal benefit payments deposited to the account during a two-month period and to ensure that the accountholder is given access to an amount equal to that sum or to the current balance of the account, whichever is less.

According to the Department of the Treasury, the Financial Management Service (FMS) began encoding Automated Clearing House (ACH) payments to enable receiving financial institutions to easily identify Federal benefit payments subject to the requirements of the interim final rule.

The procedures and guidelines apply only to Federal benefits paid electronically via the ACH. Financial institutions are not responsible for examining accounts to identify Federal benefits paid by Treasury check.
